
















Water

Plan to be with out water

- ➤ Identify your shut off valve- in case of leak
- Store 1 gallon/person/day (Non-breakable containers)
- > STORE MORE THAN THAT
 - Bathtub
 - Hot water heater (Isolate)







Wastewater

- "If yellow, let mellow. If brown, flush it down"
- Waterless toilets use a sealing liquid such as vegetable oil which keeps the odor contained as the urine passes through.









Stormwater

- ► Flood Insurance
- Sandbags
- ► Valuables above flood line
- ► Follow evacuation
- ▶ Build accordingly





Emergency Kits











American Red Cross Recommendations

- ▶ Water: one gallon per person, per day (3-day supply for evacuation, 2-week supply for home)
- Food: non-perishable, easy-to-prepare items (3-day supply for evacuation, 2-week supply for home)
- Flashlight
- ▶ Battery-powered or hand-crank radio (NOAA Weather Radio, if possible)
- Extra batteries
- First aid kit
- ▶ Medications (7-day supply) and medical items
- Multi-purpose tool
- Sanitation and personal hygiene items
- Copies of personal documents (medication list and pertinent medical information, proof of address, deed/lease to home, passports, birth certificates, insurance policies)
- Cell phone with chargers
- ► Family and emergency contact information
- Extra cash
- ▶ Emergency blanket
- Map(s) of the area

American Red Cross Recommendations Continued

- Medical supplies (hearing aids with extra batteries, glasses, contact lenses, syringes, Prescriptions, etc)
- Baby supplies (bottles, formula, baby food, diapers)
- Games and activities for children
- Pet supplies (collar, leash, ID, food, carrier, bowl)
- Two-way radios
- Extra set of car keys and house keys
- Manual can opener

Always Prepare for the Worst
