| 14 | as "the corporate limits of the City of Lewes, the territory beyond such limits authorized in [the |

| 17 | WHEREAS, Section 4.20 of the Lewes BPW Charter authorizes the Lewes BPW to "enact |
| 18 | and adopt such rules and regulations as the [Lewes BPW] may deem proper in order to supply said |
| 19 | utility services"; and |

| 21 22 | WHEREAS, the Lewes BPW provides an important service to the residents of the City of Lewes and those ratepayers residing outside of the corporate limits of the City of Lewes as |
| 23 | stewards of the utility systems within its jurisdiction and, accordingly, takes care to ensure that |
| 24 | current and future customers have access to safe, reliable, and affordable services; and |

| 26 | WHEREAS, in accordance with its duties, the Lewes BPW desires to ensure that the |
| 27 | plumbing and sewer systems within the Lewes BPW Service Area will continue working properly |
| 28 | to safely manage wastewater; and |

| 30 | WHEREAS, the flushing of fibrous materials, namely wet wipes, baby wipes, sanitary |
| 31 | toilettes, and other non-flushable items, can lead to costly damages to the Lewes BPW's pumping |
| 32 33 | stations and wastewater management plant; and |
| 33 34 | WHEREAS, on August 15, 2021, Pump Station #4 was rendered temporarily out of |
| 35 | service, likely due to the flushing of non-flushable materials; and |
| 36 | service, intery due to the hushing of non hushable materials, and |
| 37 | WHEREAS, in order to avoid future clogs and, thus, carry out the duties of the Lewes |
| 38 | BPW and meet its above-described objectives, the Lewes BPW desires for residents and ratepayers |
| 39 | to refrain from flushing wet wipes, baby wipes, sanitary toilettes, and other non-flushable items |
| 40 | that should instead be disposed of in the trash. |
